Workforce Development



Launched in 2023, our week-long program with Boston Children's Hospital has grown to offer CPR and Basic First Aid certification for 7th and 8th graders, complemented by science lessons taught by students from Harvard Medical School.


Leadership Development

Fundraising Overview


